

Pathway A: Equivalency Review (Documented Prior Learning)

- 1. Student Arrives in Canada and Begins School
- **2.** Planning with Principal → Determine Graduation Plan
- **3. Eligibility Check** → All students are eligible (no limit to equivalency credits).
- 4. Student Submits Official Documentation → Proof of successful course completion;
 Official Translations may be requested
- 5. School/Registrar Contacts Prior School → Involves verifying curriculum with BC Ministry or Certified Subject Matter Expert
- 6. Evaluation Against BC Standards:
 - Alignment with BC Learning Outcomes
 - Scope, Content, Depth
 - Assessment & Grading Standards
 - At least 80% of BC learning outcomes met
- 7. Does Course Meet Equivalency Standard?
 - → No → No Credit Granted X
 - → Yes → Proceed to Credit Outcome
- 8. Credit Outcome → Credit Granted if Course Prepares Student for Further Learning
- **10. Timeline** → Usually completed in 1–2 school terms
- 11. Credit for Language Learning → Students may receive credit for language learning in their first language. (Example: a student who took Spanish 7, 8, & 9 in their home country may receive credit for Spanish 10, 11 & 12.)



Pathway B: Challenge Process (Undocumented Prior Learning)

- 1. Equivalency Review is Not Possible → Proceed to Challenge Process
- 2. Check Readiness Requirements:
 - → Evidence of Prior Learning Demonstrated <
 - → Teacher Recommendation for Challenge <
- 3. Initiate Challenge Process (Led and Supported by Teachers)
- 4. Assess the Following Areas:
 - → Big Ideas
 - → Curricular Competencies
 - → Course Content
- 5. Assessment Methods:
 - → Exams
 - → Presentations
 - → Interviews
 - → Portfolios
- **6. Credit Standard** → Recommended 80% Passing Grade
- 7. Transcript Note → Grade is Recorded & Included in GPA
- 8. Documentation Required → Full Records Kept for Potential Ministry Audit
- **9. Timeline** → Typically Completed Within 1 Term

M Important → Equivalency Review/Challenge of required courses is not possible for International students who have not taken the last 2 years of High School in English. The following are required courses that must be taken with a BC Certified Teacher:

- → Language Arts 10
- → Math 10
- → Science 10
- → Social Studies 10
- → Career Life Education 10
- → Physical & Health Education 10
- → Applied Design, Skills & Technologies 10
- → Language Arts 11
- → Math 11
- → Science 11
- → Social Studies 11
